1 Remember: Most verbs in Cornish form the simple past tense (3rd ps) by adding *-as* to the stem

verb		present	past

A few verbs have *-is*

Some verbs are irregular

2 godhvos means to know how to

My a wor kewsel Kernewek *I know (how to) speak Cornish*; ty a wor lewya karr *you know how to drive a car etc.*

This is often translated in English as 'I can speak Cornish' and 'you can drive a car' so do not confuse it with gallos. My a yll kewsel Kernewek implies I am able to speak Cornish because there are other Cornish speakers around
The present tense of godhvos: gonn vy, godhes ta, gor ev/hi, godhon ni, godhowgh hwi, godhons i
